

Protocol for Jointly Badged Awards Schedule



1 Purpose

To set out the arrangements for managing jointly badged Awards.

2 Scope

This schedule must be read in conjunction with the Program Accreditation Procedure and is subordinate to it.

3 Schedule

A jointly badged Award is an Award offered by the University and one or more other institutions. A Student graduating from a jointly badged Award Program graduates from each and every institution accredited to offer the Award. This Protocol describes the arrangements to be followed for managing such jointly badged Awards where similar arrangements are not specifically dealt with in the accreditation process and documentation, or in written understandings among the participating institutions.

1. A jointly badged Award must be accredited by each and every institution offering the Award according to each institution's standard practice.
2. There must be a management committee comprising at least one member of each institution.
3. For each Student, there will be a home institution. The home institution is the institution which initially admits the Student into the program.
4. Communication regarding the jointly badged Award 'as a whole' (such as finalisation of graduation) will be managed by the home institution.
5. With respect to Courses in which a student is enrolled, unless otherwise specified in the accreditation documentation, a Student shall be bound by the rules, regulations, policies and procedures of the institution offering the Course.
6. A Student's eligibility to be admitted to a jointly badged program must be confirmed by each and every institution offering the jointly badged Award.
7. A Student's eligibility to graduate must be confirmed by each and every institution offering the jointly badged Award.

8. Graduating Students may choose which institution's graduation ceremony they wish to attend.
9. A graduating Student will be considered a Graduate of the University regardless of the institution holding the ceremony attended by the Student.
10. The Testamur will have the logos and seals of each and every institution offering the jointly badged Award, and will be signed by an authority nominated by the Vice-Chancellor of each institution.
11. Where the Courses studied at another institution are also shown on the University transcript, the results of failed Courses will be shown as well as Courses that have been passed.

The categories of Award are listed in the Program Nomenclature Schedule.</p> <p>Award Program</p> <p>A sequence of study which leads to an academic qualification granted by the University and conferred by Council.</p> <p>Course</p> <p>A discrete element of a program, normally undertaken over a single Study Period, in which the Student enrolls, and on completion of which the Student is awarded a grade.</p> <p>Graduate</p> <p>A Student upon whom Council has conferred an Award.</p> <p>Student</p> <p>A person who is enrolled in a UniSQ Upskill Course or who is admitted to an Award Program or Non-Award Program offered by the University and is: currently enrolled in one or more Courses or study units; or not currently enrolled but is on an approved Leave of Absence or whose admission has not been cancelled.</p> <p>Testamur</p> <p>A certificate issued by the Council of the University to signify that a Student has satisfied the requirements of a specific program and has graduated.</p> <p>University</p> <p>The term 'University' or 'UniSQ' means the University of Southern Queensland.</p>
